INFORMAL LUNCHEON WITH BIG HORN BASIN LEGISLATORS:

President Prestwich introduced the 2009 Institutional Fact Card and spoke of Northwest College's enrollment growth and its impact on the campus. Summarizing the system of colleges' 2010 Legislative

Agenda detailed in a brochure recently printed by the system of colleges, Dr. Prestwich focused on requests for the standard budget continuation, enrollment growth funding and the Wyoming Investment in Nursing program. He highlighted the tremendous

enrollment growth seen among the state's colleges and the challenges

they face in providing programs and services in a financial

environment where revenues are declining.

In addition to enrollment growth, topics introduced and discussed by Trustees and Legislators included how the community colleges' block grant is distributed, unpredictable revenue from the seven college districts given the volatility of county valuations, the state's

recapture/redistribution program, outreach centers/colleges in Gillette

and Laramie, and the Hathaway Scholarship Program.

Trustees thanked the six north Big Horn Basin legislators for their

time and attendance at the lunch meeting.
